**Principal's Message:** The staff of Rosedell would like to wish all the students and families a happy, safe and relaxing Winter Holiday. Enjoy your special holiday traditions with friends and families! We look forward to seeing everyone return ready for a great second half of the school year on Monday, January 14<sup>th</sup>.

**Tragedy in Connecticut:** At Rosedell Elementary, we are deeply saddened by the senseless tragedy in Connecticut. Our hearts and prayers are with the families of the children and staff at Sandy Hook Elementary. This heart-breaking and shocking tragedy reminds us how important it is to follow our security procedures. As a friendly reminder to ease parents' minds, Rosedell is considered a "closed" school. Our gates are locked after the children enter the premise. All visitors must sign-in at the office and receive a visitor badge. Adults on campus without I.D.s or badges will continue to be approached by staff members and directed back to the office for signing in. In the event of an emergency, our staff is trained in "lock down" procedures while administrators and office members have delineated roles to notify police and help secure the children and school premises. Our next scheduled "lock down" drill was already scheduled for January, since we just completed our large Disaster Drill. In addition, this week we have an added presence with Sheriffs routinely driving by and checking in with me.

In regards to our students, psychologists have noted that it is very important that schools and parents continue with the "routines" and a sense of "normalcy" to ensure the children continue to feel safe and secure at school. We have not interrupted our scheduled events this week; winter performances, class projects and parties, sing-a-longs etc. and encourage parents to shield your children from the ever-present news and tv coverage, particularly for our very young children. Attached is a detailed District letter from our Superintendent, Dr. Lucid, addressing the tragedy and providing a District perspective.

While these tragic shootings cannot be predicted, we will continue to be vigilant in ensuring our school facilities are in working order and staff is receiving constant training to ensure the safety of all our students and staff. As the nation grieves for the Newtown community, please keep them in your thoughts and prayers.

**Rosedell's "Snowball Effect" on Santa Clarita!** The entire staff is **SO PROUD** of our Rosedell students for the massive success in collecting canned food for a food drive to help Santa Clarita's needy families.
