Currently, all of our Rosedell classes are very full and there is no room for movement of students between classes. Reconfiguring of classes and the addition of split grade level classes are still possible in the next few weeks. <u>IMPORTANT – Sign up for Parent Conferences in MPR!</u> You will also have an opportunity to sign up for parent conferences (September 17-21) during Back-To-School Night. So please bring your calendars, Iphones, Blackberries and Androids so you can sign-up for conferences in the MPR. Please plan to join us for this important evening and remember this event is for parents only. <u>There will not be child supervision provided during parent presentations in the classrooms</u>. We will begin promptly at 6:30pm on the outdoor stage facing the lunch tables.

STAR Testing Reports-Delayed By State: 2012 STAR individual state testing reports for 3rd -6th grade students will be mailed to parents in the next week. Due to students at other districts up and down California who posted test questions on social media during the STAR testing period, the state has had to reconfigure the tests eliminating those schools and students to ensure accuracy in comparison reports of students/schools/districts. Please ensure that you received your student's report by September 13th. Last year's fifth grade students will also have an additional report for their 5th Grade P.E. Test results.

School Safety Procedures:

<u>Parents at Drop-off and Pick-up</u>: Beginning this week, parents will be asked to follow typical school procedures for visiting and dropping off students at the school. Parents, please say good-bye at the gates to the playground and K playground so we can get students into the routine and determine the identity of adults who are not employees. If you are visiting the school or classroom, please report to the office so you can sign in and receive a visitor's badge. Please don't be offended if a staff member asks you for help if you are not wearing a visitor badge. As usual we will be closely monitoring any adults that are on campus before and after school begins. Kindergarten parents, please bring your K children to the K yard by the K parking lot so we don't have additional unidentified adults crossing the campus. Thanks!

Driving at Drop off and Dismissal: Please do not use the front side parking lot by the office as a drop off or pick up zone. Gates will be closed at 1:50-3:10 to eliminate cars driving through the front parking lot, which is heavily populated with students during dismissal. In the morning, please use the valet with the cones and not the parking lot as a drop off. Bypassing traffic through the parking lot ties up more traffic when trying to merge in front of the official Valet line. Thank you for following the rules so we have the utmost safe environment for our 820 students!

<u>Valet Program</u>: For parents using the Valet line in the mornings, please have your child exit on the right hand side of the car. Exiting on the left hand side is dangerous due to traffic on Urbandale, prohibits the valet student from helping the student out the car and delays the process. In the valet line, drivers should never get out of the car. If you need to leave the car, please park in the neighborhood. Drivers getting out of the car significantly delay the process of getting children out quickly, safely and efficiently. Also please pull up to the very front of the line when able. Students can open their own doors if there's not a valet door opener, so please do not wait for someone to open each door, unless your child is too young to open their door. We will be training 4-6th grade students with our Deputy on August 29th so please be patient as we get our valet up and running. Also we open at 7:40, so please come early to help with the flow of traffic. If parents wait until 8:00am, it will always be impossible to get everyone onto the playground in time for the bell at 8:10. Thank you for your cooperation!

<u>Changes in the Cafeteria- Message from Food Services Agency:</u> We would like to welcome our new cafeteria supervisor, Diane Reagan, to Rosedell. Miss Amanda switched schools with Mrs. Reagan for this new school year. Important message from Food Services: With the beginning of the new school year all "Al a Carte" AKA "Red Cart" (snack) sales will be <u>cash only</u>. The children will not be able to purchase from the cart using their computer account. Thank you for your continued support.

District Focus: Systematic ELD, Intervention and Brain-Based Direct Instruction (BBDI): We will continue to train teachers and implement the following district mandates:

- Brain Based Direction Instruction (BBDI) Focused direct instruction methods during teaching to increase student learning and academic achievement.
- Response to Intervention (RtI) Leveled grouping of students in K-4, four days a week for ¹/₂ hour, focusing on direct instruction in reading. Regular "progress monitoring" of students through assessment determines students' movement between these grade level reading groups. The focus is intense reading instruction in the various levels of reading comprehension and decoding (phonics). In 5th and 6th grade, intervention occurs in each classroom (small group instruction, working with resource teacher, math groupings, etc.)
- Systematic English Language Development Systematic instruction in language acquisition for English Language Learners

Rosedell's Art & Technology School Focus: We are looking forward to continuing to explore our unique **ART & TECHNOLOGY** focus. We will continue with our special partnership with the Performing Arts Center (PAC) through the College of the Canyons. Every grade will enjoy a high quality artistic/cultural performance with Performing Arts Center performers from around the country. Many of our grades will be bussed over to the PAC to see their various performing arts assemblies. In addition, we have special PAC performers who will be coming to Rosedell for unique student lessons and performances in our MPR. Parents are welcome to join our RO assemblies. Chaperoning the PAC performance. We will also continue having our annual musical, which is an after-school enrichment program. Musical

Instruments and Band Ensemble for 3rd-6th grade will continue to be offered through our after-school enrichment program.
